### General Summary

Perform routine maintenance and complete repairs on diesel engines as well as other parts of a truck, trailer and various other equipment. Perform annual inspections. To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The qualifications listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and / or ability required. Reports directly to Logistics Manager.

### Essential Duties, Responsibilities & Authorities

- Lifting 25 to 50 pounds
- Twisting, turning, stretching, straining, bending, kneeling and climbing
- Standing, excessive walking for long periods of time
- Troubleshoot class 8 vehicles, trailers and various equipment
- Welding – mig on aluminum and HR steel
- Tire changes, mount and dismount
- Oil changes per scheduled mileage
- Alternator, battery, starter, belt replacements
- Fiberglass repairs
- Truck and trailer servicing, shocks, air bags, brakes, tie rods, springs, tarp, sideboards (replacement as needed)
- Parts Inventory control
- Other related duties as assigned by supervisor

### Qualifications:

- Basic knowledge of welding techniques on aluminum and steel, tire changing, mounting and dismounting, engine rebuilds, Allison transmissions, rear ends, PTO's a must, electrical troubleshooting, preventive maintenance experience, hydraulics experience.
